

Enrolled in the Masters of Secondary and Specialized Education of the Deaf program at the National Technical Institute for the Deaf at Rochester Institute of Technology, Rochester, New York. Over the years, have offered my knowledge, and enterprise in American Sign Language in many capacities—as a teacher, tutor, and have also served as an American Sign Language model for prelingually Deaf children of varying
